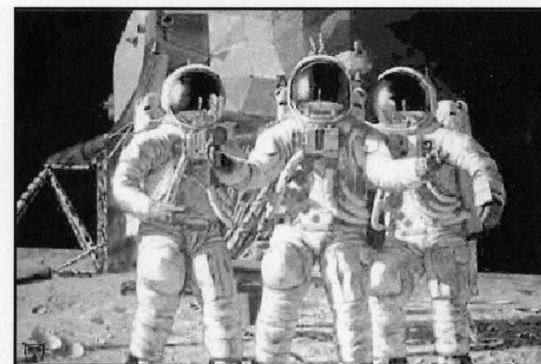

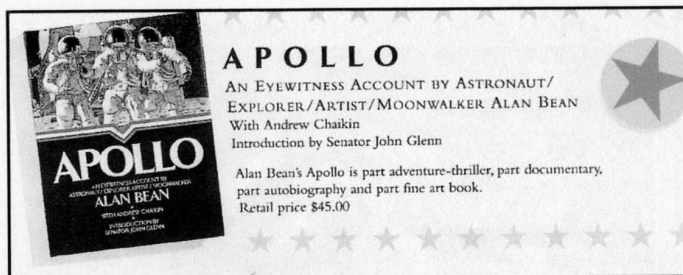


The Fantasy by Alan Bean, depicts Conrad, Gordon and Bean on the Moon's surface.

Welcome To An Evening With Alan Bean

Alan Bean, born 1932 in Wheeler, Texas, was an Apollo XII astronaut and the commander of Skylab II. During that mission, he was the fourth man to walk on the surface of the moon. He set a record of 24,400,000 miles traveled during the 59-day flight. He has also launched himself successfully into a new career as artist and author.

When Alan wasn't flying, he enjoyed painting as a hobby. During training and between missions as a test pilot and astronaut, he continued private art lessons. On space voyages, his artist's eye and talent enabled him to document impressions of the Moon and space to be preserved later on canvas. His art reflects the attention to detail of the aeronautical engineer, the respect for the unknown of the astronaut, and the unabashed appreciation of a skilled painter.



Alan Bean's book, *Apollo, An Eyewitness Account*, chronicles his first person experiences as an Apollo astronaut in words and paintings. The book was received with critical and popular acclaim upon its publication in 1998.
